now had confirmation from Blaby District Council that the funding has been agreed for the new play equipment for Carey Hill Park.

This will replace the Pirate Ship which has come to the end of its life and has been used well in the last 10 years.

VILLAGE HALL REFURBISHMENT







Over the last 9 months a building refurbishment has been taking place on the village hall and this part is almost complete! The building is now safe, watertight, modern and functional...we hope you like it, it's a vital community resource! Following an inspection and condition survey of the building, the floors had to replaced and repaired, chimneys removed to remove severe damp issues, we reinstating the date stones at either end of the building, full external drainage was installed to prevent water entering

the building, a full electrical upgrade, a new fire exit and high quality fire alarm, redecorating throughout and the discovery and modifications of the well, car park resurfacing plus new additions like a large projector system for our users to hire! To be a Councillor you need to:

- *Be over 18
- *A commonwealth, Irish Republic or EU citizen
- *Meet ONE of the following four requirements
- · Be on the Electoral Roll in Stoney Stanton, or
- · Have lived in or within 3 miles of Stoney Stanton for the last 12 months, or
- · Have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises for the last 12 months, or
- Have had your principal or only place of work in Stoney Stanton for the last 12 months

The Fosse Villages Neighbourhood Plan

was accepted at referendum by a huge majority on May 6th 2020.
