We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise are the following in December 2023. **Priority 1: Road Safety**

You said: That Road Safety issues are your number 1 concern.

What we are going to do: Targeted speeding enforcement operations and issuing Traffic Offence Reports (TORs) where appropriate.

Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

You Said: Anti-Social Behaviour including use of motorbikes was an issue to you.

What we are going to do: Targeted patrols of hotspot locations as identified by local residents. If perpetrators are identified then appropriate action will be taken.

Priority 3: Drug dealing/taking

You Said: Drug dealing and taking was an issue to you:

What we are going to do: Where intelligence is received of drug dealing or taking it will be appropriately assessed and action taken against offenders.

What we are doing

Priority 1: Road Safety:

- This month the beat team have completed speeding checks on Hinckley Road, Sapcote. 40 Vehicles were checked with 4 exceeding the 30mph speed limit by travelling in excess of 40mph. The offending drivers were stopped and dealt with accordingly. Please keep an eye out on social media as a speeding operation is planned in the near future. If there are any areas of concerns you want us to target please get in touch.

Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

- This month issues have been raised in Croft due to suspicious activity happening in the car park of the church. Enquires are on -going to identify the perpetrators. Patrols will be taking place in the area to deter further incidents.

Priority 3: Drug dealing/taking:

- As of 02/12/23 there has been 1 report received within the Fosse Villages of drug dealing/ taking. The intelligence is being assessed and appropriate action will be taken in due course.

News

Due to community concerns about speeding in the Fosse Villages. The beat team have conducted a speeding operation this month on 30/11/23.

Over 40 vehicles were checked in the area of Hinckley Road near to the junction of West Field Road whether they were compiling with speed limit.

I'm pleased to report that out of all the vehicles checked 4 were found to be exceeding the speed limit by going over 40mph plus.

Those drivers were stopped and dealt with a appropriately.

Power Tool Thefts - OP Pioneer.

We often receive reports of power tools being stolen from vans across our area.

Access to vans will either be by attacking the doors and locks or simply cutting a hole in the bodywork and then stealing the tools inside.

Clearly the impact of this type of crime is significant, not only is the cost of replacement of these items expensive but it often leads to the victims being unable to complete their work, which for many who are self-employed means a loss of a day or weeks pay!

On 01/12/2023 your local beat team successfully located and recovered a large amount of power tools! Over 50 items were located and seized from a secure container and now we are looking to reunite these with their owners.

Following reports of tools stolen from Worcestershire that may have made their way to Leicestershire, Hinckley and Blaby's Neighbourhood Priority Team used their own 'tools of the trade' to developed intelligence as to their location. As a result an application was made to the court for a warrant to search a specific unit. As a result of this we were not only able to locate and recover the stolen tools from Worcestershire, but also a number of other power tools which we suspect to be stolen.

We encourage van drivers and tradesmen not to leave tools in vans overnight, and to try to ensure CCTV and lighting is present wherever your van is parked to deter thieves from targeting your vehicle!
