BIODIVERSITY POLICY

What's in the Policy:

The object of this policy is to work towards enhancing and protecting the biodiversity of the land at Stoney Stanton.

The Council will aim to improve the biodiversity of the area in the following ways:

- manage its land using environmentally friendly practices that will promote biodiversity
- support local businesses in the adoption of low impact practices
- support residents and local organisations activities to enhance and promote biodiversity

The Natural Environment and Rural Communities Act 2006.

From 1 October 2006 every public authority must in exercising its functions have regard so far as it is consistent with the proper exercise of those functions to the purpose of the conserving biodiversity.

This act means that parish and town councils can spend funds in conserving biodiversity.

Specific Actions:

- The Council will consider sustainability, environmental impact and biodiversity when commenting on planning applications
- The Council will, whenever possible, consider the conservation and promotion of local biodiversity in all its activities, particularly regarding the management of its open spaces
- The Council will aim to work in partnership with the development of environmentally friendly areas created by residents, local organisations and businesses
- The Council will raise awareness of environment and promote conservation projects in conjunction with appropriate bodies.

Adopted: 12.11.24
