HNRFI UPDATE

The Stoney Stanton Action Group submitted a detailed written representation to the examining authority by the October deadline. A copy of it can be viewed on our website, https://stoneystanton.co.uk.

In the week beginning October 30th, members of the group attended both the Open Floor hearing and the Issue Specific Hearings. Alberto Costa, MP for South Leicestershire and Luke Evans, MP for Hinckley and Bosworth, both spoke in opposition to the HNRFI proposal. You can watch recordings of the meetings using the links on the Planning Inspectorate website https// Infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk. More Open Floor Hearings will be held on 11th December.

The full examination timetable can be found via the Planning Inspectorate website above. The examination will close by March 12th 2024. The Planning Inspectorate will then pass on details of the examination and their recommendation to the Secretary of State for Transport, Mark Harper, who has up to three months to make the final decision.

We will be handing out our Bags of Kindness around Stoney Stanton during a session close to Christmas.


